to and from work in that new-to-him car, and supported himself with the money he earned. When we last spoke, Erich shared that one day, he wanted "to be independent enough to give back."

He worked while earning his college degree and graduated in 2020. Passionate about cars, he dedicated many long hours to learning the ins and outs

of caring for his own vehicle, purchased from Baxter Toyota Lincoln.

Erich is kind, hard-working, and curious, and recently, we had the chance to catch up with him. Of the past year and a half, he said, "When I graduated, I knew I wanted

to keep working with cars, and I knew I wanted to be a part of something bigger than myself."

Over the past eighteen months, Erich's interest in cars has only grown. When Erich used Opportunity Passport™ savings match to purchase his vehicle in 2019, he worked with Ryan (pictured left) at Baxter Toyota Lincoln. For several years, Ryan has been a volunteer with Opportunity Passport™, sharing with

When Erich graduated college, he applied for a job at Baxter. Now, he works with Ryan! Together, they volunteer with our Opportunity Passport™ program and guide participants through the process of purchasing a reliable vehicle.

Erich said, "It feels amazing. I know exactly what people are going through in Opportunity Passport™, and now being able to use my skills and experience to give back, when the program helped me so much—I feel really lucky. Not many people get to come full circle like this."

What a spring it's been. As community cases of COVID-19 continue to lower and vaccination rates rise. our community is beginning to re-open. We're seeing

friends and family again. At Community Action, we've been able to spend more time with our participants, in-person. For many, after a year of immense uncertainty, there is hope. And for our neighbors served by Community Action, a great deal of that hope is made possible by you.

Over the past year and a half, many of our neighbors have faced the unimaginable. As the pandemic forced many businesses to close, many who were previously making ends-meet lost their jobs. For the first time in their lives, many families found themselves having to make impossible decisions—such as, with limited funds, whether to pay rent or a medical bill. Parents searched for support to find the affordable, quality early childhood education

they needed in order to return to work. When they needed support, they turned to Community Action. They turned to you.

Many of those who shared their stories in this newsletter sought support from Community Action due to circumstances brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. The words "thank you" seem too small to cover all that you've done for your neighbors. In a time of crisis, you were a safe haven. The true reach of your impact cannot be measured.

And yet: We know that last year, your support of Community Action allowed us to increase our rent, utility, and deposit payments to 30% more homes than in 2019. You helped us serve 5,277 more hot, nutritious meals at the Gathering Place. You supported delivery of

food, diapers, and supply items to 479 babies, toddlers, preschoolers, and their family members. And so much more.

Moving forward, we'll need to continue working together. Your tremendous support during this year's Give to Lincoln Day is just one example of how much we can accomplish when we work together. Thanks to your generosity, we raised a preliminary total of \$101,989 before match to support Community Action.

The road to economic recovery remains long, especially for those we serve. But with you by our side, we'll make it there stronger than ever.

Community Action Head Start is growing

We're opening a new full-day, full-year early childhood center in Lincoln!

n April 21, Mayor Leirion Gaylor Baird and Community Action announced that Community Action received a \$1.6 million annual grant from the Office of Head Start to expand our Early Head Start programming in Lincoln. Funding will allow us to add 72 additional full-day, full-year center-based enrollment slots for infants and toddlers.

Your support makes possible our work to provide children and families with opportunities for success in school and beyond.

Funding from this grant will also allow Community Action to open a new early childhood education center at 2615 O Street.

The new center will house nine classrooms, with services provided at no cost to families. Thanks to partnership with Speedway Properties, the building will be renovated specifically to support young learners. We anticipate the new center will open in October. We'll keep you updated!

had always seen Community Action here in Lincoln for as long as I have lived here. In fact, I was once working with a group of folks that did a donation drive for Community Action. It was some eight years later that I needed help but did not know where to turn.

I was not homeless, destitute, or near homeless. I was just in a situation that was entirely too unhealthy to continue living and raising my child in. I needed something to change, but did not know where to turn. For a long time, I resigned to the idea that I was just stuck where I was. That I should just keep focusing on getting my child through high school and into college, so they could at least move out and move on.

But yet, I still knew if I was not setting a healthy example, my child had a high probability of following suit.

I began emailing different service providers but was turned down almost everywhere I turned... Finally, one agency did refer me to Community Action's Community Response program, and to Sam.

Sam was the first person to tell me that she would meet with

me. Not only would she meet with me, but she would do so under whatever conditions I was most comfortable. I remember her even telling me that she would sit with me on my front porch, if need be.

Sam renewed the strength I knew that existed in me.

This program allowed her to help me. I was able to move out of the situation with my child and into our own apartment. We have our first therapist appointment this month to begin our own healing process. I am again empowered to be myself. Without this program, I would still be stuck where I was.

I wholly and truly am grateful for this agency and the help they have given me and my child. I truly hope that this program continues and that the next 'me' is able to find their Sam and move to the next great step in their life.


"They were so excited to pick out new
