In September 2021,
Community Action purchased the facility at 1843 K Street, formerly known as the Kaplan University Building or the historic Lincoln School of Commerce. Although Community Action has been providing Head Start services at this location since 2016, this purchase allowed us to expand from beyond our previous occupancy of just

one wing.

We're building a center designed specifically with small children and their families in mind; and we're creating a resource hub for the surrounding neighborhoods which have some of the highest poverty rates in Lincoln. When complete, we'll be able to use this center as a space for early childhood education and so much more—ESL courses, professional development

offerings, financial coaching, and more as families work to meet

their unique goals related to economic stability.

Spring has been a busy season here at Community Action, and in a very good way! I'm thrilled to be writing to you, as we've had such wonderful news to share over the past few months.

First, thank you for your tremendous support during this year's Give to Lincoln Day.

Last month, you helped to raise nearly \$56,000 before match to benefit Community Action programs and those we serve. Thank you.

These dollars will make such an incredible difference. Your support will give young learners classroom spaces and support to grow to their greatest potential. You'll give families safe, stable homes in which to live. You'll give warm, nutritious meals to neighbors who need them most. Your support makes our work possible.

Within Community Action Head Start, we've just finished Phase I renovations on our recently-purchased facility at 1843 K Street. This center, when operating at full capacity (which will be happening soon!), serves 197 babies, toddlers, preschoolers, and their families. We've been

dreaming for a long time about having a permanent home for Head Start in Lincoln: Now one exists.

When complete, this center will serve as a hub for high quality early childhood education and family support services. It will change for the better the future of early childhood education in Lincoln.

At Community Action we've been doing a lot of talking about the future. Community Action is in the final year of our current Strategic Plan. Our board of directors and leadership team are collaborating to draft our next five-year plan, using information from participants, staff, volunteers, community stakeholders, and our completed Equity Audit and Action Strategy to inform the agency's goals for the next several years. I look forward to updating you more on this

project, and the agency's identified priorities relating to addressing the causes and conditions of poverty in Lancaster and Saunders Counties, in the coming months.

Throughout this newsletter are more stories of some of the opportunities you've given to others. As you read, I hope you remember that this newsletter is just a small glimpse of what you make possible every single day. The truth is your impact cannot be conveyed in a single newsletter. It can't even fully be described in words.

"I had lost so much of my support system," said Sarah. "It was just a horrible year. I thought I might have to put all my stuff in


storage and have nowhere to go. I was really in trouble. Then I saw Community Action's phone number and I called."
