A moment in Kathy's kitchen

The menu changes daily at the Gathering Place. Except for Tuesday.

"Everyone knows it's Taco Tuesday," said guest Jeffrey, fondly known as Papa Smurf. "It's a tradition."

"And I love it," says another guest, walking by with a tray made just for their food allergies.

Behind the scenes, Kathy makes it all happen.

"I'm prepping for tonight—21 pounds of meat, maybe 30," said Kathy as she cooks in the Gathering Place's tiny kitchen. "We're never totally sure how many guests we'll serve. Could be 150, could be 175. That's why we always have a backup plan," Kathy says with a smile. "Because we're never for sure."

As Operations Manager, Kathy knows the planning and prepping involved to feed the Gathering Place community. Her workspace is like trying to host a dinner party in a food truck. The equipment is powerful,

but the space is tight. Every step is a shuffle. Every task a juggle. "It takes practice," she laughs. "A lot of practice."

She visits the Food Bank every Wednesday, orders fresh fruits and vegetables, and coordinates meals with care and precision. The shelves that run throughout the back of the kitchen and into the basement are stacked with canned goods. And the massive white board in the dining room holds the week's menus, grocery lists, and inventory, keeping the team organized.

Papa Smurf is a regular at the Gathering Place. "You never know how many folks it will be," he said. "But I'm in no hurry. On Tuesday, I'll grab the burrito, wrap it up, hands free," he laughed.

Waiting in the side room, out of the heat, a group of guests start throwing out ideas for Kathy to consider: Why only Taco Tuesday? How about Meatloaf Monday? Spaghetti Saturday? Fish Friday? And bingo on Thursday!



The gentle ribbing is worth it to Kathy. "Just serving the community here is great just to know everybody is getting fed."

Rapid Re-housing is at the core of our Supportive Housing Program. It's the process a Community Action advocate engages in with families to help them overcome barriers and quickly transition from homelessness to stable, permanent housing. You make it possible for families like Julia's to find their way back to solid ground.

Julia came to us unhoused, with three children and the weight of world on her shoulders. "When you're worried about survival... that's what consumes your life," she shared.

One year into working with Community Action, now safe in an apartment, Julia is learning financial skills, using wraparound supports like the Community Action Store, and building her own path toward self-sufficiency.

"When you get help and survival's not your main worry, you can start flourishing."

Last year, 81% of participants in homelessness prevention programs maintained safe, affordable housing for at least 180 days. **Zero participants** returned to homelessness.




