

ver the past year, need has grown astronomically for free nightly meal service at our soup kitchen, the Gathering Place. We knew if we were going to keep up throughout 2024, we needed help from our entire community. We needed **you**.

In mid-October, we asked for your help to raise \$200,000 for our soup kitchen. Thanks to the generosity of lead sponsor Acklie Charitable Foundation and others, donations were matched \$1 for \$1 from mid-October through the end of 2023.

You showed up for the Gathering Place and our guests. Your generosity was astounding. In fact, it was record-breaking. You helped raise over \$275,000 for Community Action's

Gathering Place! Thank you.

By giving to our 2023 Gathering Place Match Campaign, you helped ensure that we're able to step up and continue

feeding our community.

And you helped ensure the Gathering Place will remain so much more than a soup kitchen. For our guests, the Gathering Place is also a place to spend time in community with friends, somewhere warm to visit when the nights are cold, and ultimately, a place of hope.

Last month, we served over 4,000 meals in just 29 days. This was a record for February, and we anticipate the need will continue to grow throughout the year. Without

Spring has always been my favorite season. For as long as I can remember, the sight of a lone dandelion or sound of a robin singing on a sunny morning have always filled me with joy. It is this time of year in which the energy and promise of new life abounds, and thanks to the seeds you've sewn through your many contributions, you can feel this energy at Community Action, too! There are so many updates to share since my last message.

One of the most exciting is that the renovation of our K Street Head Start Center is nearly complete!

In December we completed Phase II of the project and 82 children moved into their new classrooms, which are big, brimming with natural light, and designed in a way that meets their developmental needs. Our dedicated team members also now have the space they need to train, work toward advanced credentials, and simply take a minute or two away from the classroom to regroup in their new break and wellness rooms. Phase III of renovation (the final stage!) is underway right now and we anticipate completion by late summer. This project could not have happened without the support of friends like you, and we cannot wait to celebrate with you when it's finished!

In another reflection of gratitude: **you helped us raise more than ever** during our holiday campaign for the Gathering Place: **over \$275,000** including the match committed by our sponsors! You stepped up like never before, and we couldn't be more thankful. As I shared in my December message, need for evening meals has reached historic levels over the past year, and simply put:

Last year at this time my gas bill was \$399. I just received my

current bill and it is only \$150 in spite of all the days below freezing temps.

Everyone I dealt with in the program was so friendly and professional. They kept me informed about everything. If I had any questions, I would always give a call and could count on their help. All the contractors who worked on my home were the best. They knew what they were doing and got the job done.

Finding stability through community

and peace.

You make possible the partnerships needed for neighbors like Greg to find safety and stability.

reg is a kind, compassionate, and dedicated son. When his mother grew ill last year, he sacrificed a great deal to care for her. As his mother's primary caretaker, Greg was unable to maintain employment. Keeping her safe and comfortable was his primary focus.

When Greg's mother passed earlier this year, he lost everything.

Grieving the loss of his mother and unable to find other employment, Greg was eventually unable to maintain his family home. He became unhoused and began living outdoors. Knowing he needed extra support to get back on his feet, Greg reached out to Community Action.

You believe in your neighbors like Greg. <u>You believe in</u> compassion, hope, and opportunity.

And you believe in ensuring that every one of your neighbors can access the opportunities needed to live well. Because of this belief and your support of Community Action, when Greg came to us for support, we were able to assist.

Thanks to a long-standing partnership with a local property owner who understands the needs and barriers of those we serve, our Emergency Services staff were able to find safe, stable housing for Greg. Greg met with the property owner and signed his lease to move in immediately. **He's now settling into his new home.** There, he'll be able to grieve and move forward in safety, stability,

It takes a village

You create opportunities for children like Riley and their families.

With Riley's complex medical history and diagnosed developmental delays, their parent, Avery, knew Riley needed exceptional care and support as they prepared for kindergarten. That's when Riley enrolled in Community Action Head Start. When Riley began the program, they were both nonverbal and non-mobile.

From the moment Riley was enrolled, our Head Start team worked to connect both Riley and Avery to important resources. Staff such as our Health coordinator, Education and Disabilities Coordinator, and Riley's teachers partnered with Avery to identify and enroll in services that would support Riley's developmental delay.

A dedicated parent, Avery has always been wholly invested in their child's



success. By partnering with Head Start staff and using the additional services to which their family was referred, Avery was able to support Riley as they worked on skills such as walking and communicating.

Now, several years later, Riley can walk with an assisted device. They say "Hi!" and "Bye!" often, especially in the hallways at our Head Start center!

Riley is also continuing to progress developmentally, socially, and medically, thanks to their hard work and the support of their parent, our Head Start team, and you, who make our early childhood education programming possible. **Thank you.**
