Because of your support, Melinda lives in a safe home that makes her proud.

hen Melinda moved from Texas to Nebraska, she left behind her career and her ranch house to be closer to her family. She purchased a small property in need of great repair, and planned to flip the home with her son's help. But after a terrible, unexpected fall on some ice, Melinda found herself with limited mobility and in constant pain. For many long winter months, she was living in a 450 square-foot house with a \$390 utility bill.



After her fall, Melinda was left without income, in a drafty home with holes in the walls that she was no longer able to fix."The house was just pouring out energy," she said. "I put my savings into this place. There was nothing I could do."

Heat rose to the uninsulated loft and stayed there. At times, Melinda barely kept warm,

and placed four space heaters throughout the house. And because of space constraints, two rested under the sinka terrifying safety hazard.

Melinda's nearby family

was busy. Her son worked two jobs and her daughterin-law went to school, and they had three young children to look after."It iust wasn't

reasonable for me to ask them for help," she said. "It wasn't responsible either. That's when my daughter-in-law found Community Action."

Your support of Community Action allowed us to provide Melinda with much needed weatherization services. We sent a team to her home for over a week, performing over a dozen repairs from the loft to the basement. Today, Melinda's

house is transformed: It's become a home.
