Strengthening Lincoln's early childhood workforce

Our workforce development program gives early childhood workers the opportunity to build new skills and advance their careers.

This April, Community Action applied for and received \$1 million in grant funding from the City of Lincoln to support strengthening our local early childhood education workforce. Funds received from this grant have allowed us to build a Workforce Development program for Head Start employees. This program will provide employment and on-the-job training to 70 people over a three-year period.

By participating in this program, staff will have the chance to earn their Child Development Associate (CDA) credential, associate's degree, bachelor's degree, or other credential. Participants receive a stipend as they reach program milestones and supports like childcare and transportation are available for those who need them.

Currently, 21 individuals are participating in Community Action Head Start's Workforce Development program. Once they receive their relevant credential, participants will be eligible for a pay increase and promotion within Community Action Head Start.

Community Action Head Start staff who participate in our Workforce Development program can get paid to earn credentials to advance their careers.

As a friend of Community Action, you know how important it is to remove the barriers that keep individuals from reaching their goals and achieving success. This program does just that. And, like all good things at Community Action, it's only possible because of your belief in us—in the work that we do and the people we serve.

Partnering for a stronger community

Beginning this fall, we've partnered with Lincoln Literacy to offer free English and adult literacy classes at Community Action Head Start at K Street.



Last month, Channel 1011 and Channel 8 each shared news stories about an exciting new partnership between Community Action and Lincoln Literacy.

This year, Head Start's back to school season wasn't just for our youngest participants. We also welcomed dozens of adult learners to our K Street center thanks to a new partnership with Lincoln Literacy!

Since late August, Community
Action Head Start at K Street has
served as a host site for Lincoln
Literacy classes offered four nights
a week. These English language
and adult literacy classes,
provided by Lincoln Literacy,
are free to both current Head
Start family members and other
Lincoln residents.

The neighborhood surrounding 1843 K Street has one of the highest poverty rates in Lincoln (41.7%), and 15% of those in the surrounding zip code speak a language other than English at home. The need for both programs' services is great. This partnership is one step toward our vision for transforming the space at 1843 K Street into a hub for community resources.

We look forward to sharing more with you about all the exciting things happening at K Street!

Building a home of love and support

elicita is a mother of four children and has been a resident of the United States for the past 16 years. When she moved to Lincoln, she could not speak, read, or write in English and could not read or write in Spanish, her native language. But she knew she wanted to build a better life for her children. And having grown up as the primary caretaker for her younger siblings and now as a mother of four, she knew the value of work hard. When Felicita learned about Community Action Head Start, she applied on behalf of her almost two-year-old son.

Every week, Felicita and her son met with their Community Action Family Educator. They spoke Spanish together and soon developed a good working relationship. Felicita was curious about how to be a strong support system for her children—how to give them a healthy home environment unlike the one she

had growing up. She wanted to and support her children in becoming the best versions of themselves.

Felicita's son became eligible for special services, and she worked together with her Family Educator to ensure he received all the supports he needed to grow alongside his peers.

When Felicita became pregnant with another child, she continued receiving Community Action Head Start services. Together, she worked with her Family Educator to learn new strategies to bond with her children. She learned how to share stories through discussion of pictures, even when Felicita herself was still learning to read the words on the page; doing so helped her children to grow their language skills and provided valuable bonding time for the whole family.

This year, Felicita's youngest child will age out of Community Action Head Start, and her family will continue moving forward. When asked how she felt about starting the next chapter of her life, Felicita smiled.

She said, "I am prepared."
