It's official: We're building a Home for Head Start

Your support will build the future of early childhood education in Lincoln.

ast month, Community Action announced the public phase of our capital

campaign to raise \$4.5 million to complete renovations at our K Street early childhood center. More than

\$2.25 million has already been raised. Funding will transform

the space located at the intersection of K Street and Antelope Valley Parkway from one used for adult education into one designed for young children and their families. Currently, 197 children participate in Head Start programming at this center.

Although Community Action has been providing Head Start services in Lincoln since the 1960s, we've never had a permanent Home for Head Start. Renovations will include building new classrooms with easily accessible restrooms and handwashing sinks, indoor and outdoor

play areas, and spaces for support services offered to participants and neighbors. Former City Council Member Carl Eskridge is chairing the volunteer fundraising effort.

"Access to quality early childhood education for all



is a Lincoln priority," said Eskridge. "And this project is about just that: ensuring children with the greatest barriers to success get everything they need to be ready for kindergarten and reach their

fullest potential."

Our K Street center is located at the intersection of three neighborhoods with some of the highest poverty

rates in Lincoln-one as high as 58%.

The first of two renovation phases were completed in early April of this year. Phase II improvements will begin in early 2023.

"The most important investment we can make is in our children. Every child deserves access to the supports they need to succeed," said Eskridge.

A couple of months ago, we celebrated the Gathering Place's 40th anniversary. You may have joined us for that milestone occasion. On that warm late summer evening, the streets surrounding the two-story brick home were filled with people – guests, neighbors, donors, volunteers, staff, passersby. Live music played jovially as those people chatted, enjoyed a lovinglyprepared meal, jotted down memories of their favorite moments at the Gathering Place, and played games – "ladder ball" and bean bag toss.
